#### **ABOUT MALTA**

The Maltese Islands have been described as an open-air museum. The archipelago lies virtually at the centre of the Mediterranean, with Malta 93 km south of Sicily and 288 km north of Africa. The archipelago consists of three islands: Malta, Gozo and Comino with a total population of 400,000. Malta is the largest island and the cultural commercial and administrative centre. Gozo is the second largest island and is more rural, characterised by fishing, tourism, crafts and agriculture while Comino is largely uninhabited. The narrow meandering streets of Malta's towns and villages are crowded with Renaissance cathedrals and Baroque palaces and with superbly sunny weather, expansive beaches, a thriving nightlife and 7,000 years of intriguing history, there is a great deal to see and do. eNews Vol.3 Issue 8 August 2010

#### VISAS

Delegates should check whether they require a visa to enter and leave Malta. Visas appear to **be required** for most Commonwealth countries (with the **exception** of Antigua and Barbuda, Australia, Bahamas, Barbados, Bermuda, Brunei Darussalam, Canada, Cook Islands, Cyprus, Malaysia, Montserrat, New Zealand, St Kitts and Nevis, Singapore and United Kingdom). Allow plenty of time to obtain your visa as this may have to be done by post to the nearest embassy. Check on visa requirements at: http://www.mfa.gov.mt/default.aspx?MLEV=52&MDIS=19.





Approximately 400 000 infants acquire HIV infection each year as a result of mother-to-child transmission. To reduce this risk WHO recommends that all women with HIV should receive antiretroviral drugs to protect against HIV transmission during pregnancy, delivery or breastfeeding.

There is good evidence that earlier and more effective treatment can prevent nearly all mother-to-child transmissions. Breastfeeding, which is essential for child survival has posed an enormous dilemma for mothers living with HIV. Now, WHO says mothers may safely breastfeed provided that they or their infants receive ARV drugs during the breastfeeding period. This has been shown to give infants the best chance to be protected from HIV transmission in settings where breastfeeding is the best option.
